A DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED RESEARCH OR CREATIVE ACTIVITY

My proposed creative research project is a minimal experimental narrative film In the Penal Colony. It is adapted from the short story of the same name by Franz Kafka. Narration will be by Ivan Cury. The music of Ludwig Van Beethoven or an original composition by Paul DesMarais will be used. In the Penal Colony is one of the most detached, troubling, and depressing short stories ever written by Kafka or any other writers that I have read. The adaptation concentrates on the part of the story that tells how an execution is carried out at a penal colony in some unnamed country. For the execution the condemned man is placed on a revolving rack (the harrow) where his sentence is written on his body with tiny needles that penetrate deeper and deeper until the execution is completed. The narration will be an edited monologue of assistant commandant dialogue. The visual will be a very tight shot of my eye, staring directly into the camera. Kafka once wrote that the eye was the only true symbol for the cinema. To put a subtle rhythm into the visual a twenty eight frame optical hold will alternate with twenty eight frames of running film through out the entire work. My goal or objective will be to find if the combination of a minimal film image will heighten the impact of the spoke word and give to the complete work a different effect but still powerful meaning to the audience.

The only other work in this area by other artists that I can think of, are the minimalist films of Andy Warhol, examples would be *Empire State Building* or *Sleep*. These films are usually silent. My work in this area, especially in my film *Red/Green*, has used sound to try to heighten the minimalism as I hope to do with In the Penal Colony. Audiences have very well received *Red/Green* and I hope my current project will also enjoy the same fate.

This project will need the original footage of the image altered optically as noted above, and the sound, both voice and music. These elements will be mixed together and titles will be added. The film will be in 16 mm color film, which will be transferred to the digital for distribution and will be approximately 9 to 10 minutes in length.

In the Penal Colony, when finished will be sent to the appropriate national and international film festivals. Distribution will be by DVD or the Web.
